

Crucifixion Riddles Hints

Jn 18:28

They led, therefore, Jesus from Caiaphas to the praetorium, and it was early, and they themselves did not enter into the praetorium, that they might not be defiled, but that they might eat the passover;

The Jews did not enter the judgment hall because they wanted to eat the passover instead of being defiled. Huh? Jesus and his 12 disciples already ate the passover. What is happening?

What is the origin of Easter? And what did the Roman Catholic church do when the Roman empire converted to Christianity? What is the origin of Easter sunrise services? What is the origin of Easter bunny? What is the origin of holy cross buns?

Which day did Jesus do the hosanna march? It wasn't the sabbath because on the sabbath, you are not supposed to walk more than 2000 amos (3167 or 3774 feet depending on how amos is counted).

What is the difference between passover and passover sabbath?

Jn 20:1

And on the first of the sabbaths, Mary the Magdalene doth come early (there being yet darkness) to the tomb,

It was dark - Mary did NOT see Jesus rising.

What happened to Thomas, one of the two whom buried Jesus, a few days after he buried Jesus. See the gospel of Nicodemus (middle section), a non-canonical book. Link is below.

What time of the day did the soldiers see Jesus rise? See the section IX of the gospel of Peter, a non-canonical book. Link is below.

Notes on the crucifixion hints

Passover and passover sabbath

A critical hint is when are the Passover and Passover sabbath? Passover sabbath is not defined in the bible. Rather it is implied in Lev 23:5-8 .

Lev 23:5-8

in the first month, on the fourteenth of the month, between the evenings, is the passover to Jehovah; and on the fifteenth day of this month is the feast of unleavened things to Jehovah; seven days unleavened things ye do eat; on the first day ye have a holy convocation, ye do no servile work; and ye have brought near a fire-offering to Jehovah seven days; in the seventh day is a holy convocation; ye do no servile work.'

There are 2 sabbaths during the week of unleavened bread feast, namely the first and the last (7th) days. The first day unleavened bread sabbath is also known as the Passover sabbath. Why so? On late afternoon of the Passover (which is NOT a sabbath) a lamb is sacrificed and roasted. This lamb is eaten for dinner on the next Jewish (Judean) day (Jewish day = evening + daytime) which is the first (sabbath) day of unleavened bread feast. The Passover date can be found by searching for "Passover crucifixion". Unfortunately, many incorrectly placed the day as Friday. Instead hunt for websites that mention the moon cycle or Nisan (Jewish first month). One such website is

Traditionalists have Jesus crucified on 31 AD. Some say Jesus was crucified on 28 AD.

Either way (31 AD or 28 AD), the Passover is on the same day. The gospel of Peter and the gospel of Nicodemus The gospel of Peter and the gospel of Nicodemus are non-canonical books, so treat them with a grain of salt. You can find these two books and other non-canonical books at Wesley Center for Applied Theology.
